<u>Beat the Street</u> <u>2022</u>




The children are very excited about the return of Beat the Street this Wednesday (14th September) until Wednesday 26th October.


On Friday, all pupils were issued with their Glow log on details for access into Google Classroom. We thank you for your patience in allowing us to set this up.

Instead of logging in as (e.g. <u>gw22smithjohn@glow.sch.uk</u> – you will most likely need to log in as <u>gw22smithjohn@sl.glow.scot</u>).

<u>Hunter Primary</u> <u>School Improvement Priorities 2022-23</u>

As we continue to progress into our 2022-23 session and reflect on all the work that was undertaken last session, I have had the opportunity to work closely with school staff to review the progress made against the identified school priorities for session 2021-22 and set the new school priorities for this academic session.

This year, our three main Improvement Priorities include:

<u>Priority 1</u>: Development of a progressive Writing pedagogy in all primary stages that ultimately raises attainment Writing.

Priority 2: Health and Wellbeing: Applying Nurture as a whole school approach

Priority 3: IDL Learning: create a progressive framework for Interdisciplinary Learning (including STEM) that ensures topics are relevant and accessible for all.

In the coming weeks we will share our Standard and Quality report for session 2021-22. I will add the condensed School Improvement Plan (SIP), Plan on a Page, on our School App.

Health Information

<u>Nut free school</u> – please do not send nuts into school in any form. We have children in school with life threatening nut allergies. Please also inform the school if your child has an infections disease such as chicken pox so that we can alert (confidentially) parents/carers who are immune compromised.

<u>Medicines</u> – all inhalers should be kept with children, however for your child's safety, we advise that you send in a spare to be held at the office. If your child needs medicine to be administered during the school day, this can be done on a voluntary basis. <u>Any medicines</u> <u>must be labelled for your child and parents/carers should complete a form at the school office</u> before we can help. Please do not send painkillers etc. in to school in schoolbags as this can pose a danger to other children.



Health Information (cont.)

<u>Healthy eating</u> – We encourage children to bring a healthy snack to school and ask parents/carers to support us by only permitting **1** snack at morning break time. Some younger classes take part in 'Fruit and book' sessions – a small piece of fruit is ideal. Children will be encouraged to bring any uneaten food from packed lunches home, so that you are aware what they have eaten. As P1-5 pupils are entitled to a free lunch, any child bringing their own packed lunch to school is entitled to help themselves to soup, fruit and yoghurt in addition to their packed lunch. Please only send in items your child can open by themselves.

Drinking water – We encourage children to bring a filled water bottle to school each day. This should have a spill proof sports cap. Children can re-fill water bottles at the water stations throughout the school.

<u>**Toileting**</u> – Your child will always be allowed to visit the toilet when needed however staff will also encourage children to ensure they go during break times in order to establish good habits and minimise disruption to learning. Please contact us if you have any concerns regarding toileting. From time to time little accidents can occur. Staff will ensure your child is comfortable and if possible will provide a change of clothes for your child. We will let you know, and it may be that we require you to collect your child as staff are unable to physically clean or change your child. A spare set of clothing can be sent in and kept in school, for any child experiencing toilet issues.

<u>P.E. safety</u> – it is vital that jewellery is not worn during P.E. Ear piercing should be avoided during term time however if your child's ears have been pierced, please provide **micropore** tape so that they can cover their ears and take part in important P.E. lessons. Please ensure your child can remove earrings or that they are not worn to school.

Period Poverty – please note that free sanitary products are available in school.



Attendance and Absence reporting

Children should come to school unless too unwell to attend. Our school attendance rates are usually very good however we see a direct correlation between attendance and attainment. Pupils with lower attendance rates fall behind their classmates, are less resilient and confident. All pupil attendance is monitored regularly and where an attendance rate falls **below 90%**, this is monitored weekly. Where there is a pattern of poor attendance the Head Teacher will contact the parent/carer to discuss whether there are any supports that can be put in place. It is also helpful to contact the school should you have any attendance concerns regarding your child. It is our priority to work together in partnership to ensure the best outcomes for all children.



If your child is going to be absent from school, please contact the school office and leave a message on the answer facility (**option 1 to report a child's absence**). Please tell us your *child's name, class and specific reason for absence*. Please note a specific reason is needed to authorise your child's absence.

Attendance is recorded as either 'authorised' or 'unauthorised'. We are unable to authorise holidays taken during term time (please contact the Head Teacher in the first instance to discuss this) or an unexplained absence. Absence through illness or appointments are 'authorised' where we have the exact reason for absence.
