Instead of logging in as (e.g. <u>gw22smithjohn@glow.sch.uk</u> – you will most likely need to log in as <u>gw22smithjohn@sl.glow.scot</u>).



# <u>Loaves and Fishes/</u> Foodbank donation

Hunter has had a long association with Loaves and Fishes spanning many years and at our assembly on <u>Friday 7<sup>th</sup></u> we will welcome representatives who will talk to the children about what they do and who they support.

As a school, we are keen to continue supporting the Charity. If you are able to support us, we are asking for a small donation to go towards their foodbank appeal.

Some examples of items that can be donated include:

- Packeted food (pasta, rice), Super noodles, pot noodle, any biscuits, tinned meat (hot dogs, tuna, etc.), tinned vegetables, dried pules (red lentils, scotch broth mix), cup of soup, cereals.
- UHT milk, coffee, diluting juice, gravy granules, soup
- Pet food, including cat and dog food
- Toiletries including: deodorant (all kinds), children shampoo, children bath soap, soap, baby wipes, toilet roll, washing up liquid, laundry tables.

#### Nurture at Hunter

At Hunter, we are a nurturing school. Nurture (including Health and Wellbeing – particularly mental health) is very much on many people's minds as we hear lots about it on social media, newspapers, the television, etc. Health and Wellbeing remains one of our top key priorities this academic year. To support the work we are undertaking, the school has been lucky to receive some additionality funding from both South Lanarkshire and the Scottish Government. This funding has allowed **Ms. McAdam** to be released from class three days a week to drive our Nurture priority forward.

Working alongside <u>all</u> staff (Teaching, Support and Facilities), staff are all being trained on Nurture principals and pedagogy all with the aim of best supporting all pupils in our school to ultimately get the best out of them and to raise achievement and attainment.

Throughout the year, as we develop Nurture further, there will be opportunities for parents/carers to get involved. We will be in touch with more information at a later date.

We are currently transforming one of our spare classrooms into a 'nurture classroom' where small groups of children will visit and take part in various activities with Ms. McAdam and another member of staff.

To help us create our classroom, we are looking for some items. If anyone has any:

- Yoga balls
- Mats
- Play tunnels
- Tents
- Massage tools
- Sensory/fidget toys or such like



these would be useful for our new sensory classroom.

We are also looking for soft toys, baby dolls, kids' kitchen, giant jigsaws and snap cards for our play area.

#### PEF - Participatory Budgeting

Some of you may remember that last year we sought the spending views of our young people and parents/carers to identify how we could spend approximately 5% of our PEF budget (Pupil Equity Funding) through the device of Participatory Budgeting (PB). PEF is allocated directly to schools to help close the poverty related attainment gap. Mrs. McLaughlin (P5, Room 6) teacher led this, and the result was attractive painted playground games on our playground surface.

We are now looking for views from parents/carers once again for this academic year. The identified amount we have to spend is just over £3000 – the equivalent of 8% of our PEF budget.

Thank you to those of you who have already submitted a response to our survey. There are a few days left to share your views – please use the Google Form link <u>PB Google Form Link</u>. Mrs. McLaughlin will collate these views and meet with the 'PB Pupil group' and discuss this with the children. As you can imagine, our young people have some great views too.

When this information is collected and collated, we will then share this with our school community and ask both parents/carers and pupils to vote for their preferred option.



## Raising Achievement and Attainment: Hunter House System

Our Hunter House system is back this year and our four House teams are well on their way to gaining their first points of the new session.

This has been in place for some years now and is very popular with both the children and the staff. Pupils across the school in Primaries 1-7 are organised into one of the four houses:

- Bruce House (Blue)
- Burns House (Green)
- Graham Bell House (Yellow)
- Wallace House (Red)

Overseen by Mrs. Baddeley, the House Captains and Vice Captains, children across the school can gain House points for literally anything they do well that is recognised by a member of staff or visitor to the school. This includes items such as:

- ✓ A good piece of work
- ✓ Demonstrating good manners
- ✓ Good walking throughout the school
- ✓ Super lining up
- ✓ Demonstrating the Hunter values, good citizenship, and a lot more

At our weekly assemblies, House captains and vice captains will tally up total scores to date and share these with the children.

On a termly basis (October holiday, early December, mid-March and end of May), the winning house will receive a prize. The first prize will be a PJ day on **Friday 14**<sup>th</sup> **October.** As always, we will communicate this to parents/carers via the usual channels.

Children remain in the same House throughout their time in Hunter and although most children know what House they are in, we will be posting House groups for pupils in Rooms 1 and 2 on their respective Google Classrooms.
