We will prioritise children in classes who are yet to receive some Nurture


intervention this session. Parents/carers of those children will be contacted

Our Hunter ducklings will arrive in school and will be looked after by our Primary 1, Room 1 children for 10 days. This will form part of our Science and Health and Wellbeing programme, looking at life cycles in Primary 1 and 2.
