<u>Glow and</u> <u>Google Classroom - <mark>Update</mark></u>



Thank you to those of you who have no managed to sign into Glow/Google Classroom to access homework tasks, class information and seeing some of the superb learning taking place.

There are a number of children who have still not yet accessed the platform. I will shortly be contacting those families to offer some support in signing up/into. Please contact me in the first instance if you have misplaced your child's log on details/instruction letter and I will re-issue this.

Useful hints and tips:

- On a laptop or PC, Google Classroom works best using the Google Chrome web browser.
- On an apple or android device you can download the Google Classroom app via your device app store. When logging in, you may need to log in a slightly different way. Instead of logging in as (e.g. gw22smithjohn@glow.sch.uk you will most likely need to log in as gw22smithjohn@sl.glow.scot).

Health Information ~ Important

<u>Nut free school</u> – please <u>do not</u> send nuts into school in any form. This includes sweet treats such as Nutella. We have children in school with life threatening nut allergies. Please also inform the school if your child has an infectious disease such as chicken pox so that we can alert (confidentially) parents/carers who are immune compromised.

<u>Medicines</u> – all **inhalers** should be kept with children, however for your child's safety, we advise that you send in a spare to be held at the office. If your child needs medicine to be administered during the school day, this can be done on a voluntary basis. <u>Any medicines must be labelled for your child and parents/carers should complete a form at the school office before we can help. Please do not send painkillers etc. in to school in schoolbags as this can pose a danger to other children.</u>

<u>Healthy eating</u> — We encourage children to bring a healthy snack to school and ask parents/carers to support us by only permitting **1** snack at morning break time. Some younger classes take part in 'Fruit and book' sessions — a small piece of fruit is ideal.

Children will be encouraged to bring any uneaten food from packed lunches home, so that you are aware what they have eaten. As P1-5 pupils are entitled to a free lunch, any child bringing their own packed lunch to school is entitled to help themselves to soup, fruit and yoghurt in addition to their packed lunch. Please only send in items your child can open by themselves.

<u>Drinking water</u> – We encourage children to bring a filled water bottle to school each day. This should have a spill proof sports cap. Children can re-fill water bottles at the water stations throughout the school.

<u>Toileting</u> – Your child will always be allowed to visit the toilet when needed however staff will also encourage children to ensure they go during break times in order to establish good habits and minimise disruption to learning. Please contact us if you have any concerns regarding toileting. From time to time little accidents can occur. Staff will ensure your child is comfortable and if possible will provide a change of clothes for your child. We will let you know, and it may be that we require you to collect your child as staff are unable to physically clean or change your child. A spare set of clothing can be sent in and kept in school, for any child experiencing toilet issues.

<u>P.E. safety</u> – it is vital that jewellery is not worn during P.E. Ear piercing should be avoided during term time however if your child's ears have been pierced, please provide **micropore** tape so that they can cover their ears and take part in important P.E. lessons. Please ensure your child can remove earrings or that they are not worn to school.

<u>Period Poverty</u> – please note that free sanitary products are available in school.



Scholastic Travelling Book Fair

We will welcome the Scholastic travelling book fair back to Hunter in time for Parents' Evening which takes place on Thursday 12th October.

This year, our **Primary 7, Room 9** class will organise and run the book fair as part of a class enterprise project. All pupils will have the opportunity to visit the book fair throughout the week of $9^{th} - 12^{th}$ October (see information below).

If any child would like to purchase a book, there will be an opportunity to do so at the Parents' Evening. As always, there is absolutely <u>no</u> obligation to purchase anything from the book fair. Please don't feel obliged to do so. Payments can only be made by cash. I will communicate more information via the school app prior to parents' evening.

Any commission raised from purchases will be going towards purchasing whole class reading novels in order to continue to enhance Literacy studies. Last year, thanks to your purchases, we raised **just under £600** in commission. This allowed us to buy a few whole class reader sets. Children benefitted from the new purchases immediately.

<u>Christmas/Greeting Cards</u> Fundraiser!

We are fast approaching that special time of year in school and already our children have been busy with winter themed designs to help raise money for our school fund through the use of IQ Cards.

Previously, we used South Lanarkshire Council's Print Room to make the cards. This year, IQ cards are a company that can turn your child's design into cards, thank-you postcards, sticky gift labels, wrapping paper and even magnets for the winter period, Christmas, or another special occasion. Prices range from £3 to £13.

For every order from IQ the school will receive a percentage back in commission which will go towards buying in new resources for our children.

More information on how to order will come home with your child's design on the **9**th **October**. There is unfortunately a quick turn around and any payments will need to be made by **Friday 13**th **October** via ParentPay. Look out for the information that will be sent home.

Raising Achievement and Attainment: Hunter House System

Our Hunter House system is back this year and our four House teams are well on their way to gaining their first points of the new session.

This has been in place for some years now and is very popular with both the children and the staff. Pupils across the school in Primaries 1-7 are organised into one of the four houses:

- Bruce House (Blue)
- Burns House (Green)
- Graham Bell House (Yellow)
- Wallace House (Red)

Overseen by Mrs. Baddeley, the House Captains and Vice Captains, children across the school can gain House points for literally anything they do well that is recognised by a member of staff or visitor to the school. This includes items such as:

- ✓ A good piece of work
- ✓ Demonstrating good manners
- ✓ Good walking throughout the school
- ✓ Super lining up
- ✓ Demonstrating the Hunter values, good citizenship, and a lot more

At our weekly assemblies, House captains and vice captains will tally up total scores to date and share these with the children.

On a termly basis (October holiday, early December, mid-March and end of May), the winning house will receive a prize. The first prize will be a dress down day on **Friday 13th October.** As always, we will communicate this to parents/carers via the usual channels.

Children remain in the same House throughout their time in Hunter and although most children know what House they are in, we will be posting House groups for pupils in Rooms 1 and 2 on their respective Google Classrooms.
