We thank you enormously in advance for anything you can spare as this will go straight back into the school. More information will be issued soon.






# Nurture at Hunter

What is nurture? The dictionary definition is 'to care for and protect someone or something while they grow and develop'.

The six principles of Nurture are:

- Children's learning is understood developmentally.
- The classroom offers a safe base.
- The importance of nurture for the development of wellbeing.
- Language is a vital means of communication.
- All behaviour is communication.
- The importance of transitions in children's lives.



These six principles are the building blocks of Nurture and something we are embedding across our school not just within a dedicated nurture space. All staff (Teaching, Support and Facilities) receive training and guidance around the Nurture principles and SLCs Attachment Strategy. The aim of this is to support our pupils so they can reach their full potential and raise attainment in our school. This all helps us in our goal of becoming an attachment informed, trauma sensitive establishment.

We are lucky to have a spare classroom again this year that has been transformed into a 'nurture' room. Small groups of children will work with Mrs McLaughlin in a variety of nurturing interventions.

If you have any concerns about your child and feel they may be a candidate for Nurture, please don't hesitate to get in touch with Mrs. McLaughlin. It should be noted that attending nurture is not something that every child will receive. There is specific paperwork that must be completed in order for a child to attend dedicated Nurture sessions. Sometimes the most beneficial route is to put support measures in place within the classroom.

# Adverse Weather



As we see the weather beginning to change it is important to have a plan in place to ensure the safety and welfare of all children, staff, and members of the public. (A detailed Adverse Weather Plan will be posted in due course).

#### Patch icy ground, light snow, or rain:

Where there is **patchy icy ground, light snow, or rain,** school start/finish routines will remain as normal. We advise that children are not brought to school until *just before the 9.00 am bell* and avoid entering playground spaces until then (unless attending Breakfast Club). On days of **heavy** rain, pupils will enter the building before the 9 am bell *(from 8.50 am)* where they will walk directly to their class and will be supervised by class monitors and Support Staff.

#### Heavy snow/mostly icy playground spaces:

In the instance of deep snow, SLC Head Teachers have the authority to delay school opening until **10 am**. We will ensure this is communicated as quickly as possible (via the school app, Twitter, school website).

SLC ask Janitors to guarantee <u>one</u> clear pathway into the school. Clearly for a school like ours, with many access points/gates, this would be challenging. In instances of **heavy snow/mostly icy playground spaces** Davy (janitor) will endeavour to clear as much as he is able to. I ask you to be mindful of this as it is a big job for Davy, and he may not manage all access points/routes into the school.

#### The school needs to close early:

This situation is also extremely rare and will always be avoided, where possible. Where an early closure is deemed necessary by the Head Teacher in conjunction with SLC HQ. The decision to close early will depend on the assessed safety and welfare of children, current weather conditions in the area, the weather forecast, road and traffic conditions and availability of staff.

Under these circumstances we will use all communication channels available parents/carers should: *Check for updates on the school app* - *Check the SLC and school websites for updates* - *Follow SLC and school twitter* - *Check the Parent Council Facebook page* - *Listen to local radio stations e.g Radio Clyde.*

We will then recognise your child's achievements at a future assembly. Pupils may also nominate themselves.
