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Lost Property Items

'Handle with Care' notification

All children come to school with a variety of emotions. At Hunter, we have a 'Handle with Care' alert system. If you feel we need to know about something that has happened at home that may have an impact on your child's learning in school for that particular day, please notify us at the school either by telephone or email. This information is treated with sensitivity and communicated to the class teacher and Support Staff so that we can ensure your child is as settled as possible during school hours.



Primary 7 visit to Lockerbie Manor 2025

As we approach the remaining planning weeks, parents/carers of Primary 7 children will be issued with an updated EV5 Medical check form we ask to be completed and returned to school (a letter will be issued).

A reminder that the balance should be paid prior to the trip. We have been made aware the trip was 'archived' on ParentPay and we are not quite sure why. If you are having any issue with payment, please contact Mrs. McCuaig in the office who will be able to help.

<u>Primary 6 parents/carers</u> - we will shortly issue a reminder letter to remind you that you are most welcome to begin the payment process for the P7 trip early which was discussed at the information session last year.

A further information session for families will be organised for May, prior to this years trip. We will advise you of the date.



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Expansion of Free School Meals for eligible P6 and P7 pupils

The Scottish Government recently announced a phased expansion of free school meals during term time for pupils in primary 6 & 7 if the parent/carer receives the Scottish Child Payment for the child. As from **Thursday 20 February 2025** free school meals can be awarded for eligible pupils.

Parents/carers of primary 6 & 7 pupils who are in receipt of a Scottish Child Payment should apply using the on-line form https://www.southlanarkshire.gov.uk/xfp/form/683 and also supply a copy of the Scottish Child Payment award letter showing their name, address and the child's details.

Please note pupils in primary 6 & 7 already in receipt of free school meals do not need to apply.



School Attendance

At Hunter Primary School we value excellent attendance and recognise the connection between regular attendance at school and the attainment and achievement of our children. A focus for all Scottish schools, and a key priority within South Lanarkshire is to improve attendance. Therefore, attendance is a key priority within our schools.

Our target being that pupils should attend for at least **95**% of the school session and should not be late for school. We understand that sometimes children cannot attend school due to ill health or medical reasons, however, we are keen to work in partnership with parents/carers to enable all children to attend school as much as possible.

All absences from school are required by law to be recorded. Absences will normally fall under two categories - **authorised** or **unauthorised absence**. In cases where children are unable to attend school parents/carers are asked to:

- Contact the school office if they know in advance of any reason why their child is likely to be absent from school.
- Notify the school by phone call or email before 9.30 am, stating the reason for absence and the likely date of return. Parents/carers are asked to keep the school informed if the date changes.
- Inform the school of any changes to contact details including changes to emergency contacts for their child.

Children's attendance data is monitored monthly by the Senior Leadership Team within the school. Hunter Primary use the table below to identify the level of risk and issue an appropriate attendance letter to advise parents/carers of their child's current attendance rate. Any letter issued will be supportive and is as a means of communication between school and home.


