


Hunter Primary Newsletter ~ March 2025




Letters that include information regarding your child's RSHP learning within Health and Wellbeing have been issued on ParentsPortal.

Easter Service and Easter Bonnet/Egg designing

Our Primary 5 children will be leading a short Easter Service on **Wednesday 2nd April from 9.45 am**. The Service will mark a return for our school holding the service in **Moncrieff Parish Church**. Parents/carers are welcome to attend, however as space is quite limited, we have prioritised Primary 5 parents and carers. The Service should be no longer than 1 hour.

Our annual Easter design activities will take place again this year in the final week of this term. This is always an exciting, creative time in the school and always a pupil (and staff) highlight – despite the smell!




Primary 1 and 2 pupils (Rooms 1, 2 and 3)

Pupils in Rooms 1, 2 and 3 will take part in the **Easter bonnet** design competition. Children can bring in some small decorative crafts to design an Easter bonnet. Bonnet shapes and basic art materials will be provided for the children in school. Bonnets will then be modelled by all pupils and 2 prizes per class (supplied by our Parent Council) for inventive designs.

Primary 3 – 7 pupils (Rooms 4, 6, 7, 8 and 9)

Pupils in Rooms 4, 6, 7, 8 and 9 will take part in the **hardboiled egg or Polystyrene** Easter design competition. Children are encouraged to bring a hardboiled egg into school, as well as any items they'd like to add to their design. Pupils will design the egg(s) in school and will be judged for their creativity. Two prizes will be given per class (supplied by our Parent Council). Please bring a bag into school in order to take the design home when completed.

We will showcase our bonnets and egg design as well as our winners when all the judging is complete.



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The **rules** for the competitions include:

- Bonnets and eggs are to be designed in school.
- The children, if they wish, create a 'scene' to display their eggs but the footprint for this must be no larger than A4 size. The design will be completed in school.
- A maximum of 3 eggs per design.
- P3-7 Pupils can complete a joint egg design if they wish to do so (pupils will share the prize if crowned winners).
- Pupils are can bring in small crafts into school however the school will also provide basic resources to design both the bonnets and crafts such as paint and glue.

Timeline of design activity:

Tuesday 1st April:

Bonnets – Children can bring in anything they wish to use to decorate their bonnet. They will decorate their entry in school.

Eggs - Children can bring in their eggs, a small cardboard box to create scenery and their own decorating materials.

Wednesday 2nd April:

Decorating of eggs and bonnets will take place.

Thursday 3rd April:

Finish decorating and entries set outside classroom for judging.

Friday 4th April:

Winners announced.

All entries go home on Friday. As we have had issued in the past with eggs being disposed of inappropriately, please provide a suitable bag if you wish your child to bring their egg entry home.



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School Attendance

At Hunter Primary School we value excellent attendance and recognise the connection between regular attendance at school and the attainment and achievement of our children. A focus for all Scottish schools, and a key priority within South Lanarkshire is to improve attendance. Therefore, attendance is a key priority within our schools.

Our target being that pupils should attend for at least **95%** of the school session and should not be late for school. We understand that sometimes children cannot attend school due to ill health or medical reasons, however, we are keen to work in partnership with parents/carers to enable all children to attend school as much as possible.

All absences from school are required by law to be recorded. Absences will normally fall under two categories - **authorised** or **unauthorised absence**. In cases where children are unable to attend school parents/carers are asked to:

- Contact the school office if they know in advance of any reason why their child is likely to be absent from school.
- Notify the school by phone call or email before 9.30 am, stating the reason for absence and the likely date of return. Parents/carers are asked to keep the school informed if the date changes.
- Inform the school of any changes to contact details including changes to emergency contacts for their child.

Children's attendance data is monitored monthly by the Senior Leadership Team within the school. Hunter Primary use the table below to identify the level of risk and issue an appropriate attendance letter to advise parents/carers of their child's current attendance rate. Any letter issued will be supportive and is as a means of communication between school and home.
