Instead of logging in as (e.g. <u>gw22smithjohn@glow.sch.uk</u> – you will most likely need to log in as <u>gw22smithjohn@sl.glow.scot</u>).

On **Thursday 21**st **October**, the Hunter Primary staff will take part in their annual '**Wear it Pink'** day, raising funds for Breast Cancer Now. This is close to Mrs. Baddeley's heart and if you would like your child to take part in this charity fundraiser, you may send a small donation into school with your child (cash), and those taking part can come dressed in something pink.





Health Information ~ Important

<u>Allergy aware school</u> – please <u>do not</u> send <u>nuts</u> into school in any form. This includes sweet treats such as Nutella. We have children in school with life threatening nut allergies. Please also inform the school if your child has an infectious disease such as chicken pox so that we can alert (confidentially) parents/carers who are immune compromised.

<u>Medicines</u> – all **inhalers** should be kept with children, however for your child's safety, we advise that you send in a spare to be held at the office. If your child needs medicine to be administered during the school day, this can be done on a voluntary basis. <u>Any medicines must be labelled for your child and parents/carers should complete a form at the school office</u> before we can help. Please do not send painkillers etc. in to school in schoolbags as this can pose a danger to other children.

<u>Healthy eating</u> — We encourage children to bring a healthy snack to school and ask parents/carers to support us by only permitting $\mathbf{1}$ snack at morning break time. Some younger classes take part in 'Fruit and book' sessions — a small piece of fruit is ideal.

Children will be encouraged to bring any uneaten food from packed lunches home, so that you are aware what they have eaten. As P1-5 pupils are entitled to a free lunch, any child bringing their own packed lunch to school is entitled to help themselves to soup, fruit and yoghurt in addition to their packed lunch. Please only send in items your child can open by themselves.

<u>Drinking water</u> – We encourage children to bring a filled water bottle to school each day. This should have a spill proof sports cap. Children can re-fill water bottles at the water stations throughout the school.

<u>Toileting</u> – Your child will always be allowed to visit the toilet when needed however staff will also encourage children to ensure they go during break times in order to establish good habits and minimise disruption to learning. Please contact us if you have any concerns regarding toileting. From time-to-time little accidents can occur. Staff will ensure your child is comfortable and if possible, will provide a change of clothes for your child. We will let you know, and it may be that we require you to collect your child as staff are unable to physically clean or change your child. A spare set of clothing can be sent in and kept in school, for any child experiencing toilet issues.

<u>P.E. safety</u> – it is vital that jewellery is not worn during P.E. Ear piercing should be avoided during term time however if your child's ears have been pierced, please provide **micropore** tape so that they can cover their ears and take part in important P.E. lessons. Please ensure your child can remove earrings or that they are not worn to school.

<u>Period Poverty</u> – please note that free sanitary products are available in school.



Participatory Budgeting (PB)

Every year we seek the spending views of our young people, parents/carers and staff to identify how we could spend approximately **5%** of our PEF budget (Pupil Equity Funding) through the device of Participatory Budgeting (PB). PEF is allocated directly to schools to help close the poverty related attainment gap. Mrs. McLaughlin (Acting PT and P5/6, Room 7 teacher) leads on this alongside her pupil focus group.

We are now looking for views from parents/carers once again for this 2025-26. The identified amount we have to spend is just short of £2000.

At the Parents' night on Thursday 9th, there will be an opportunity for you to cast your vote.

This year, the children have identified the following items:-

- ⇒ ICT equipment, including Chromebooks and mice.
- ⇒ Money to support reducing the cost of school trips.
 - ⇒ Art resources/supplies.
- ⇒ Indoor play resources such as Kapla, KNEX, LEGO, etc.

We will announce the winner shortly.



Fruit and Book ~ whole school initiative

To raise the profile of healthy eating/healthy snacks and reading for pleasure, all classes take part in Hunter's 'Fruit and Book' initiative. This is class specific with some classes taking part in daily, whilst others may be on selective days (this should be posted on your child's Google Classroom).



We ask for parents/carers to help us by providing 1 piece of fruit on the 'fruit and book' days. Extra fruit is available for the children after lunch; however, we do not have an endless supply. As always, we thank you for your support in this popular activity.



Raising Achievement and Attainment: Hunter House System

Our Hunter House system continues this year, and our four House teams are well on their way to gaining their first points of the new session.

This has been in place for some years now and is very popular with both the children and the staff. Pupils across the school in Primaries 1-7 are organised into one of the four houses:

- Bruce House (Blue)
- Burns House (Green)
- Graham Bell House (Yellow)
- Wallace House (Red)

Overseen by Mrs. Baddeley, the House Captains and Vice Captains, children across the school can gain House points for literally anything they do well that is recognised by a member of staff or visitor to the school. This includes items such as:

- ✓ A good piece of work
- ✓ Demonstrating good manners
- ✓ Good walking throughout the school
- ✓ Super lining up
- ✓ Demonstrating the Hunter values, good citizenship, and a lot more

At our weekly assemblies, House captains and vice captains will tally up total scores to date and share these with the children.

On a termly basis (October holiday, early December, mid-March and end of May), the winning house will receive a prize. The first prize will be announced shortly. As always, we will communicate this to parents/carers via the usual channels.

Children remain in the same House throughout their time in Hunter and although most children know what House they are in, we will be posting House groups for pupils in Rooms 1 and 2 on their respective Google Classrooms.

Celebrating Success and Achievement

- ✓ 'Star Spot' award Children will be nominated by their class teacher for a good piece of work. This will then be displayed on the new 'Star Spot' award board outside our Nurture room room 3.
- ✓ **The 'Heart of Hunter' award** Children being nominated for displaying the Hunter values and overall great citizenship.
- ✓ **Playground award** this is awarded to pupil by our Support Staff. To achieve this award, Support Staff will identify pupils in all classes for displaying good behaviour, manners, supporting friends, helping outside, etc.
- ✓ 'Hunter's Got Talent' award We are very aware learning doesn't just happen in school. We would like to recognise and celebrate the wider achievements and successes outside of school. This is where we need <u>you</u>, the parent/carer. If your child has achieved something at an out of school club for example or demonstrated something positive at home and you would like this to be recognised, a nomination sheet will be posted online that can be completed and emailed into our school office. We will then recognise your child's achievements at a future assembly. Pupils may also nominate themselves.

Our <u>nomination box</u> is <u>situated at the school office</u> and paper copies of the nomination form will also be found at the school office (please come and take one whenever you wish). 
